The Karuna Girls College in Lumbini, Nepal, opened its doors in June 2013 with a modest enrollment of 25 students. Today, more than 320 girls attend the school, and in five years, Health Reach Canada hopes to enroll 500 girls each year.

The Karuna Girls College focuses on education beyond elementary school for teenage girls and vocational training for disadvantaged women.

In poor traditional families, girls are not expected to continue past elementary school. They are normally married off & forced to live with and take care of the husband's family. Parents have to pay large dowries to get their daughters married and thus girls are seen as a burden on the family.

The lack of girls' education contributes to several systemic global problems:

- Corruption (lack of social responsibility)
- Lack of basic health
- Severe malnutrition
- Family hygiene
- Over-population
- High infant/mother mortality rates

Apart from offering English, Math, Science and other academic subjects, the school provides basic life skills such as nutrition, physical education, agriculture, and environmental awareness.
